

Juneteenth Activities 2024: Juneteenth, officially Juneteenth National Independence Day, is a federal holiday in the United States. It is celebrated annually on June 19 to commemorate the end of slavery. The holiday's name is a portmanteau of the words "June" and "nineteenth", as it was on June 19,1865, when Major General Gordon Granger ordered the final enforcement of the Emancipation Proclamation in Texas at the end of the American Civil War. The Juneteenth Committee of Wilmington Inc. and Speak Ya Peace will host an afternoon of celebration with poetry readings, spoken word and music! The afternoon opens with libations and a reading from Langston Hughes followed by words from historians Sonya Bennetone Patrick and Mama Makeda. Hear music and poetry from Soltree Reign and take part in community conversations from local organizations. Sample local flavors from food trucks, and enjoy children's activities in the galleria. We want to thank everyone who contributed to making our May contributions so successful. Thanks to a few extra Tithes received, we met our Mission Plan goal for the month. These contributions gave us some funds that begin to make up for our previous monthly deficits. During the month of May, 66 families contributed - with the weekly range being 18 to 28 families. A Call for Amazing, Selfless, Dedicated Volunteers! From Becky Doherty, Program Coordinator New Hanover County Senior Resource Center (910-798-6406, 910-798-6411, or bdoherty@nhcgov.com 2222). Food insecurity continues to be a huge issue in New Hanover County. Food programs are growing weekly, and we are working to spread the word about the need for volunteers. Over the next few weeks, we hope to fill many of the vacant volunteer roles with the following community partners:

- New Hanover County Home Delivered Meals Program: volunteer drivers needed now more than ever; permanent routes are available. And mileage reimbursement offered.
- Bread for Life Senior Pantry: 2-3 volunteers needed to assist with delivering food every 3rd Friday of the month from the Bread for Life Senior Pantry (N. Kerr) to low-income residents at Hadden Hall (Caswell St.). Loading and unloading cars with food. Reliability and good transportation are paramount. Shift is approx. 8:30-11:00.
- Feast Down East Mobile Farmers Market: FDE volunteers greet customers, bag food purchases, and as cashier utilize an iPad system (if applicable). Shifts are less than three hours and volunteers will be on their feet. Volunteers receive a \$15 market credit for helping out and there is flexibility as you choose your shift and location through SignUpGenius.
- First Fruit Ministries: Various roles available. FFM is a nonprofit organization in Wilmington that provides outreach (including many meals/food programs) and supportive housing to people experiencing homelessness and human trafficking.
- Good Shepherd Center: Front Desk Volunteers assist shelter staff and interact with guests. Saturday and Sunday sorters needed for Second Helpings food salvage program. Sub drivers and subs for dinner groups also needed.

AmeriCorps is seeking volunteer drivers: Help homebound seniors by delivering meals (AmeriCorp serves 650 seniors per day!). Monday through Friday, schedules are flexible. Drive your own car; reimbursement for mileage is available. Routes take 1.5-2 hours. Background screening required. Orientation June 12, at 2:00 and another will be held in July. 

A mighty storm named freedom rained over them. Soaked them clean. Mothers kissed hope into the air above babies' heads. Grandmothers and grandfathers stretched prayers into a sky that would not bend. Men asked where will this freedom live. Children asked what does this freedom taste like. What does this freedom smell like. What does this freedom sound like. What does this freedom look like. Mama, tell me what this freedom gonna feel like. We screamed a jubilee into the clouds. We shed the skin of a slave. We shed the rags of a slave into the river. Our freedom skin was a shining brand-new nakedness that outshined the sun. We be clothed in freedom's gold. On Juneteenth dead bones came alive and flew on the wings of Sankofa birds all the way back to the river where blood is born ... All the way back to the womb that never forgets. We are the Juneteenth resurrection ... We are the ancient prayers answered. We are the cup overflowing inviting generations to this feast of freedom.
